## Police and Fire Personnel, Salaries, and Expenditures, 1999

The Police and Fire Personnel, Salaries, and Expenditures surveys were sent in the winter/spring of 1999 to all municipalities with populations 10,000 and over. Of the 2,880 cities, towns, villages, boroughs, and townships that received surveys, 1,413 responded (49.1%).
