## Police and Fire Personnel, Salaries, and Expenditures, 2002

The *Police and Fire Personnel, Salaries, and Expenditures* surveys were mailed in the winter/spring of 2002 to all municipalities with populations 10,000 and over. Of the 3,200 cities, towns, villages, boroughs, and townships that received surveys, 1,484 responded (46.4 %).
