PURPOSE

ICMA has received funding from the Gates Foundation to cultivate local government leadership around boosting upward economic mobility and opportunity (EMO) for up to 50 local governments.

The primary focus of this solicitation is to identify one or more consultants who will provide technical assistance for up to 50 local governments. The consultant and ICMA will help up to 50 local governments develop "resource roadmaps" that identify relevant opportunities for funding, strategic partnerships, and in-kind/other supports to advance their local economic mobility and opportunity priorities.

ABOUT ICMA's Economic Mobility and Opportunity (EMO) GRANT

ICMA has been awarded a grant from the Gates Foundation to drive awareness and adoption among ICMA's membership and other local decision-makers of tools, resources, and strategies supporting economic mobility and opportunity in their communities. Among other strategies to accomplish this goal, this workstream aims to assess and identify local economic mobility and opportunity funding avenues through the creation and facilitation of resource roadmaps. This is to provide a long- and short-term strategy to obtain external funding and resources to support the upward mobility of local governments.

SCOPE OF WORK

Consultants are expected to have deep subject matter expertise in EMO. In addition, consultants should be well versed in diverse funding streams along with strategies for stacking multiple funding streams to advance projects/initiatives prioritized by the local governments.

ICMA will connect the local governments to the consultant(s) when technical assistance is requested. Once the consultant(s) and local government are connected, the consultant(s) will lead the technical assistance and provide a report upon consultancy completion.

It is anticipated that each local government and respective consultant(s)' relationship will be unique and different depending on the needs of the local government. This may range from one in-person meeting to five (5) virtual meetings, a group the size of one city manager to several departments. Additional tools and resources are to be brought by the consultant.



Anticipated Deliverables

- 1. **Custom Resource Roadmap Development.** The primary form of technical assistance desired is 1:1 intensive, short-term support on resource roadmapping for up to 50 local governments **completed no later than December 31, 2025**.
- 2. **In-Person and/or Virtual Training on Resource Roadmapping.** The development and execution of trainings and workshops to provide local governments with guidance on how to develop their own resource roadmaps and related topics. Opportunities are to be identified in conjunction with the consultant and ICMA staff.

TYPE OF CONTRACT TO BE AWARDED

The type of contractual arrangement is TBD. However, it is anticipated that it will be a fixed price with payments per set of deliverables under a Deliverable-Payment Schedule. Payments will be issued via a complete, correct submitted invoice and approved by the ICMA Program Manager/Director.

CONTRACT TERM AND DELIVERY DATES

ICMA expects this scope of work to be completed in a timely manner. Final delivery dates will be negotiated upon award; all work must be submitted and finalized by no later than December 31, 2025.

EVALUATION AND AWARD PROCESS

Offers will be evaluated based on the submitter's ability to match the qualifications outlined in this solicitation.



Evaluation Criteria

- 1. Business Description and Range of Services (10%):
 - Clarity and comprehensiveness of the business description.
- 2. Experience in Providing Technical Assistance and Training Services (35%):
 - Demonstrated experience in providing technical assistance to local governments.
- 3. Project Plan and Timeline (40%):
 - Detailed project plan outlining key activities and deliverables.
 - Clear definition of consultant responsibilities.
 - Feasibility and practicality of the proposed timeline.
- 4. Cost Estimate (15%):
 - Detailed and transparent cost estimate for performing the outlined scope of work.

ICMA reserves the right to award under this solicitation without further negotiations. The respondents are encouraged to offer their best terms and prices with the original submission.

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE RESPONDENTS

Respondents interested in providing the services described above should submit a proposal following the prescribed format in the Submission Requirements section of this RFP.

Adherence to the proposal format by all respondents will ensure a fair evaluation with regard to the needs of ICMA. Respondents who do not follow the prescribed format may be deemed non-responsive. GENERAL CONDITIONS

Proposal Submission - Late proposals and proposals lacking the appropriate completed forms will be returned. Faxed proposals will not be accepted. Proposals will not be accepted at any other ICMA location other than the email address above. If changes are made to this solicitation, notifications will be sent to the primary contact provided to ICMA from each Respondent. ICMA takes no responsibility for the effective delivery of the electronic document. The vendor offer will be rejected if the vendor modifies or alters the electronic solicitation documents.

Contract Award - ICMA anticipates making one award under this solicitation. It may award a contract based on initial applications without discussion, or following limited discussion or negotiations. Each offer should be submitted using the most favorable cost and technical terms. ICMA may request additional data or material to support applications. ICMA expects to notify Respondents in



approximately one month from the proposal due date whether your proposal has been selected to receive an award.

Limitation - This solicitation does not commit ICMA to award a contract, pay any costs incurred in preparing a proposal, or to procure or contract for services or supplies. ICMA reserves the right to accept or reject any or all proposals received, to negotiate with all qualified sources, or to cancel in part or in its entirety the solicitation when it is in ICMA's best interest.

Disclosure Requirement - The Respondent shall disclose any indictment for any alleged felony, or any conviction for a felony within the past five years, under the laws of the United States or any state or territory of the United States, and shall describe circumstances for each.

When a Respondent is an association, partnership, corporation, or other organization, this disclosure requirement includes the organization and its officers, partners, and directors or members of any similarly governing body. If an indictment or conviction should come to the attention of ICMA after the award of a contract, ICMA may exercise its stop-work right pending further investigation, or terminate the agreement.

No Gifts - It is ICMA's Policy that no gifts of any kind and of any value be exchanged between respondents and ICMA personnel. Discovery of the same will be grounds for disqualification of the Respondent from participation in any of ICMA's procurements and may result in disciplinary actions against ICMA personnel involved in such discovered transactions.

Equal Opportunity - In connection with the procurement of the specified services, the firm warrants that it shall not discriminate because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, political affiliation, non-disabling physical and mental disability, political status, matriculation, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, genetic information, status as a veteran, physical handicap, age, marital status or any other characteristic protected by law.
