Multi-sector leadership is defined as "actions that are intended to inspire partnership and collaboration with individuals and organizations representing different sectors – primarily government, business, and civil society."

Multi-sector leaders are responsible for "fostering conditions where stakeholders from different sectors can formally come together to combine their assets and achieve a shared goal or objective."
